> The Chamber of Commerce and Industry of Slovenia office building is considered to be the building marking the slovenian transition period that happened in the nineties. It is still used as the institutional building, but the semi-public spaces as lecture and meeting areas are extensively rented for different events and it is perceived as an open house by the general public. In 2004 a new addition was built on one of the top floor terraces known as „The Panoramic Garden“ - a new type of informal meeting area. The building was extensively published in architectural press as archplus, NZZ Folio, Architektur Aktuell, A+U, Werk, Bauen & Wohnen, Wallpaper magazine and others.
